# Bolder Options


Teaching youth to succeed in all of life's races

Bolder Options is a transformational mentoring program for at-promise youth. Once we have identified youth who need support, we match them with volunteer mentors who meet with them every week for a year participating in healthy and fun activities planned by our staff. Each pair sets physical health, academic, and social/emotional health goals. After meeting goals and staying together for at least a year, pairs graduate and are invited to stay involved through our Alumni Program.
